WHO WE ARE?

We are Barnsley Hospital NHS Foundation Trust . We are your hospital and we are responsible for your data.



WHAT IS 'PERSONAL DATA'?



Personal data is information about you, for example, your name, where you live, your date of birth, your address.

It includes other information we collect to help us deliver your care, for example, the records on your medication and your health.

WHY ARE WE COLLECTING YOUR PERSONAL DATA?

We have to collect some of your data so that we can make sure your time at the hospital and how well you are doing is recorded properly.

Sometimes other departments and other hospitals will need to use your information and results to help you get better. This will not be just you but all children in the hospital.



WHERE DO WE GET IT FROM?



Some of the information comes from your family when you come to the hospital. Sometimes it comes from doctors or another hospital you were at previously. And some of it comes from you, such as how well you are doing and your results.

WHAT DO WE USE IT FOR?
